

## SÃO PAULO, SP - CARMO DA CACHOEIRA, MG

### 1) Airport-Bus Terminal

At the airport (Guarulhos International Airport), go to the counter of the BusService private transportation company and buy a ticket to the Tietê Bus Terminal (a.k.a “Rodoviária Tietê”)

### 2) São Paulo, SP – Carmo da Cachoeira, MG

<b>Viação Santa Cruz</b> It's another option, but it only goes to the city of Três Corações, MG, 35 KM (22 miles) away from Carmo da Cachoeira. See note below.	Approximately R\$ 70,00 (~U\$ 23)	Daily at 8h30 a.m., 1 p.m., 4:30 p.m. and 11 p.m.	Approximately. 5 hours

Note: The route Três Corações-Carmo da Cachoeira can be traveled either:

- by taxi: at a cost of R\$ 100,00 (~U\$33)
- by bus: of the Gardenia company (<http://expressogardenia.com.br/>). The ticket costs R\$ 14,60 (~U\$4.50). Schedule:

### 3) Carmo da Cachoeira, MG – São Paulo, SP

You also must consult the Util company website (<http://www.util.com.br>) for the seasonal schedule. Often there is a bus departing at 1 a.m.

The other option is the Viação Santa Cruz, but it departs from Três Corações.

Schedule: 6:20 a.m., 10 a.m., 4 p.m. e 11 p.m. – It is an approximately 5-hour long trip. The value is approximately R\$ 70,00 (U\$23). Tickets are on sale online: [www.viaçãosantacruz.com.br](http://www.viaçãosantacruz.com.br)
